# UBORA IMPACT PROGRAM Health

Ubora believes that every person in the Siha District of Tanzania, Africa deserves access to quality healthcare and that medical personnel should receive training and resources which allow them to effectively provide this care. Volunteers come alongside the Tanzanian medical community, specifically at the Siha District Hospital, and assist in conducting clinics at Siha Leadership School and public schools throughout the district, as well as participate in other innovative health care initiatives.

# **OUR INTENTION**

The Health Impact Program seeks to assure quality health care for the Siha District through partnering with Tanzanian medical personnel and government officials to introduce creative solutions to help address specific health care issues in Tanzania.

## **OUR INSPIRATION**

Dr. Andrew Method, former District Medical Officer-Siha, tells the story of a woman who died in childbirth because the equipment needed to save her life was unavailable. She died en route to another facility over an hour away. Today, the hospital has that equipment thanks to the efforts of Dr. Method, Ubora's Health Pillar, and Ubora

partners and donors who helped secure two shipping containers of medicine and equipment from U.S. suppliers, valued at over \$2.5 million. Summing up his feelings, Dr. Method said, "Now, we never have to worry about mothers dying of that again."

### **OUR IMPACT**

- Community Health Workers being trained in first aid, sanitation, and nutrition to serve in their villages.
- 139,000 residents of Siha district have access to medicines and treatment not previously available
- 4,000 children have received physicals and follow up care through our village clinics
- 21 local "pharmacies" received medicine to distribute free of charge to villagers
